#### **NOTICE TO ALL PARENTS AND GUARDIANS** RE: INDUSTRIAL ACTION BY MEMBERS OF NSW TEACHERS FEDERATION ON **TUESDAY 3<sup>rd</sup> DECEMBER 2013**

We have been notified that the NSW Teachers' Federation has called on all members to support a Stop Work meeting for 2 hours on TUESDAY 3<sup>rd</sup> NOVEMBER 2013.

The purpose of the industrial action will be to hear a report from the Presidential Officers and vote on a recommendation for a new Salaries and Conditions Award.

Please be advised that the majority of teachers, including executive staff are likely to be involved in this action and therefore **normal classroom lessons will not take place** at all during period 1 and 2. The school will only be staffed to provide minimal supervision of students who attend. The Year 6 Pathfinders program will continue and will not be impacted upon by the Stop Work Meeting.

A shortened recess will run from 10.35 am to 10.45 am with the scheduled period 3 beginning at 10.45 am. Normal lessons and bell times will occur for the remainder of the day.

#### Pet dogs 'descended from Europen wolves' - ABC Science

Digging into the DNA of man's best friend, the dog, has shown their ancestors to be wolves.

A new comparison of DNA from modern canines and ancient fossils suggests that today's pets are descended from now-extinct populations of wolves in Europe.

They likely scavenged bones from scrap piles left behind by hunter-gatherers, say researchers in today's issue of the journal Science.

And the bolder the animals got, the more food they took, and the more loyal they became to humans, they say, adding this process of domestication likely began as many as 19,000 to 32,000 years ago.

"All modern dogs have a very close relationship to ancient dogs or wolves from Europe," says lead author Dr Olaf Thalmann, from the University of Turku in Finland.

#### Free Maths Tuition:




#### **Fun with Maths**



# **BUS ZONES**







You must not stop your vehicle in a Bus Zone unless you are driving a public bus.

Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

**SCHOOL ZONE** 

Penalty from \$304 and 2 demerit points

Council's Compliance Officers enforce parking signs at your school.

# There are now increased penalties and demerit points associated with all offences in School Zones.



#### No Parking

You have no more than 2 minutes for drop-offs or pick-ups and must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle.

Penalty from \$169 and 2 demerit points



#### No Stopping

Under no cicumstances are you permitted to stop on a length of road to which a No Stopping Sign applies.

Penalty from \$304 and 2 demerit points



#### **Bus Zone**

You must not stop your vehicle in the indicated zone unless you are driving a public bus.

Penalty from \$304 and 2 demerit points
